- Timeliness***

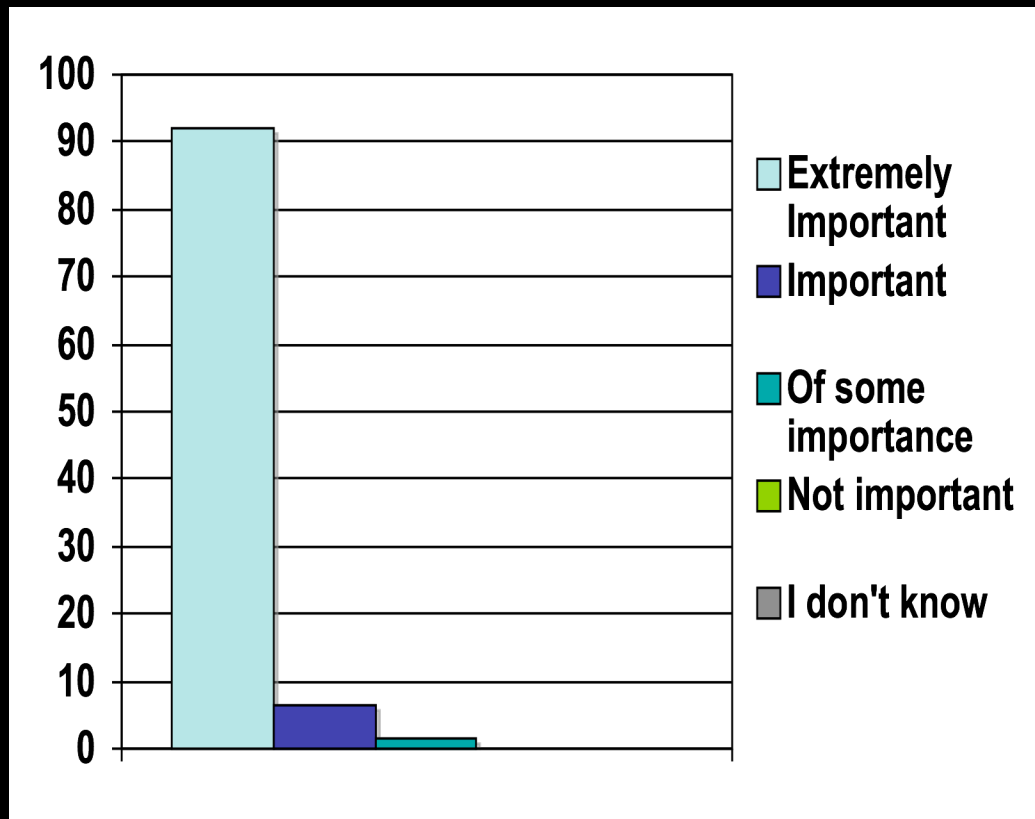
